# Numeracy Indicator

**Numeracy** is the ability to use numbers and think in quantitative terms to complete tasks. Strong **numeracy** skills are essential in many workplaces and in everyday life. Managing money and a budget, performing calculations, taking measurements, and estimating driving distances are all examples of using your **numeracy** skills.

The Numeracy Indicator is a tool designed to help you gain a better understanding of your **numeracy** skills. The Indicator contains questions that will **provide an indication** of your **numeracy** strengths and areas for improvement. This information can help guide your future training decisions and career planning.

The questions in the Indicator are based on actual tasks performed in the workplace.

## Instructions:

1. Allow yourself approximately 20 minutes to complete the Indicator.
2. Write your answers directly on the Indicator in the space provided.
3. If you are marking your own Indicator, use the *Answer Key* provided at the back. Give yourself one point for each correct answer. Do not give yourself partial marks.

- Use of a calculator is permitted but not required.

*How many packages of paper will the office use in a 5-day work week?*

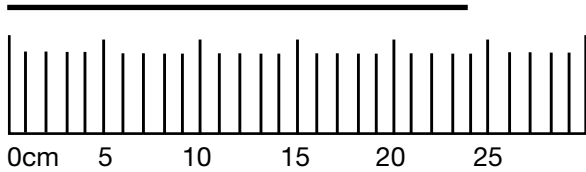
