Skills for Success

Did you know that there are nine skills that everyone needs to be successful in learning, work and life? They are called the Skills for Success and are listed below:

- Adaptability
- Collaboration
- Communication
- Creativity and innovation
- Digital
- Numeracy
- Problem solving
- Reading
- Writing

These skills are very important for apprentices. You will use them on the job almost every day if you become an apprentice. In fact, you are probably using most of these skills already!













Activity – How Do I Use the Skills for Success?

Share an example of when you have used each of the Skills for Success.
Adaptability is being able to adjust when things change around you. Describe a time when you needed to adapt to something that changed.
Collaboration is being able to work well with other people. Describe a time when you worked i a team.
Communication is being able to speak, listen and share ideas. Describe a time when you needed to communicate ideas with other people.
Creativity and innovation are being able to use your imagination and come up with new ideas. Describe a time when you needed to be creative or innovative.
Digital is being able to use computers, tablets, smartphones and apps. Describe a time when you used digital technology. What did you use?



Numeracy is being able to work with and understand numbers. Describe a time when you needed to use numbers or math.				
Problem solving is being able to find solutions when something goes wrong. What kinds of problems have you solved?				
Reading is being able to understand written words and symbols. Describe a time when you needed to read. What did you read?				
Writing is being able to communicate clearly using words and sentences. What kinds of writing have you done?

- Motive




To reduce the number of trades on this page, click on the purple Service button. Then, you will only see jobs in the Service sector.


